Chesley Coffey, the first record we have of him is when he asked for the appointment of surveyor, 1804, in Adair Kentucky (Adair Court Order Book "A", Page 116). A deed dated Dec 9, 1800, in which he sells land to John McClain, speaks of him as Chesley Coffee of Maury County, Tennessee (Deed Book "C", Page 51). He was born before 1766 as the 1810 Census of Adair County, Kentucky shows his age as "45 and up".

Jeff Ross 14 stated Chesley Coffee was the son of Joshua Coffee, b. 1745 in Prince Edward County, Virginia, grandson of Peter Coffee of Prince Edward County, Va. Joshua Coffee left a will in Guilford County, N.C., in which he names three children: no mention of Chesley Coffee. Others have also stated Joshua had just three children. I have found nothing to prove who were the parents of Chesley Coffee.

 - John Gilbreath. His gravestone in the Gilbreath-Coffee Cemetery, near Mt. Pleasant, Maury County, Tennessee shows the date of his birth as June 6, 1768; the 1850 census of Maury County shows his age as 82 and shows he was born in Virginia. We think he was in Kentucky by 1792 as descendents have stated his 2nd son was born in Kentucky in April 1792. Deed Book 2 and Page 20 of Green County, Kentucky shows 200 acres to a John Gilbreath in 1798 --- Adair County was taken from Green in 1801 --- but we have no proof of any kind that this is the same John Gilbreath. The first deed in his name in Adair County, Kentucky is dated Feb 27, 1809; he and his wife, Mary, sold land in same county in 1811 and 1817. A deed he made when he sold land in Adair County to his son, Andrew, dated Sept 24, 18818, spoke of him as "John Gilbreath of Maury County, Tennessee".

In Maury County, Tennessee there are deeds showing he bought land in 1812, 1821 and 1828; in 1828 he also (sold) 100 acres to his son, John, for \$1. He died Nov(?) 2nd 1850 and is buried in the Gilbreath-Coffee Cemetery located about 12 miles southeastof Mt. Pleasant,

Maury County, Tennessee.

I think there is a close relationship between this John Gilbreath and Hugh Gilbreath (1781-1852) of Cooper County, Missouri on Page 257. Both appear in the Adair County, Kentucky records about the same time; both were connected to the Coffee family; and both were born in Virginia according to the 1850 Census. (m) Mary Coffee, b. Sept 1752; d. Aug 24, 1853; sister of Nathan Coffee who married John Gilbreath's sister, Elizabeth; buried in Gilbreath-Coffee Cemetery. For Coffee Family see page 417.

Andrew Gilbreath. A grandson said Andrewc was born in 1728, that he moved to Mississippi from Tennessee; after a few years he moved back to Kentucky, then to Tennessee, and then to Texas about 1848. Adair County, Kentucky Marriage Records, Book 1, Page 34, shows his first marriage, "Andrew Gilbreath to Mary Richards on Dec 26, 1811". Adair County deeds show he bought 100 acres on Russell Creek in 1818 for \$500. Maury County, Tennessee deeds show he bought 50 acres June 1, 1825 and speaks of him as "Andrew Gilbreath of Maury County, Tennessee". Several of his descendents stated he moved to Texas in 1848 and that he died in 1870. He is buried in Rock Hill Cemetery, Good County, Texas.

ANDREW TURNBOW, born ca., 1780

and

GRACE COFFEE, born 1785

ANDREW TURNBOW was born in South Carolina sometime near 1780, and died on, or about, the 16th day of Oct. 1844, in Pope County, Arkansas.

We have good reason to assume that Andrew was the son of JOHN TURNBOUGH, who was living in Greenville Co., So. Car. in 1790. In the home of John Turnbough in the first Federal census, U. S. A., were seven sons. Living in the same county with John Turnbough in 1790, were WILLIAM TURNBOW, and a younger JOHN TURNBOW, who is a proven son of the older JOHN.

Although no church or Bible records have been found as proof that Andrew was the son of John of South Car., this family has been extensively researched by some very capable genealogists. Two who are outstanding in this field are; Alva S. Turnbow of Eugene, Ore., and Richard A. Clifford, of Salt Lake City, Utah. Mr. Clifford is Pres. of the Southern States Chapter of the Genealogical Asso., of Utah. Working in collaboration, these two Turnbow descendants have done a systematic and thorough search of the earliest records, land grants, deeds and probate records, marriage records and tax roles of the counties where the early Turnbow families have lived. In addition, Mr. Clifford has plotted the migration routes taken by John Turnbough, his wife Margaret, and several of their sons as they moved from South Carolina into Kentucky about 1795, settling in the counties of Green, Adair and Logan, and from there to the middle counties of Tennesee about 1811.

The result of this extensive research is sound and logical evidence that our ANDREW was one of the nine or ten sons of John and Margaret Turnbough, and was either the youngest, or the next youngest, child.

Andrew Turnbow was married Dec. 6,1802, in Adair Co., Ky., to GRACE COFFEE, (Coffey.) We find the name spelled both ways, sometimes by two members of the same family.

GRACE COFFEE, called "Gracie" was the daughter of CHESLEY COFFEE, and MARGARET (BALDWIN.) A copy of the recorded marriage of Andrew and Grace is shown in these pages. Chesley Coffee and George Turnbow, signed their marriage bond. GRACE (COFFEE) TURNBOW, died Jan. 13, 1859 in Erath Co., Tex, and was buried in a

plot that would later become Barbee Cem. A death schedule for Erath Co. 1860, gives her age as 74 at the time of her death. Her age is given on her gravestone as "about 87 years" and we know that is an error.

The year of their marriage, 1802, is the first time Andrew appears on the tax rolls. We find in Feb. 1802, he was granted "400 acres of land on the headwaters of Clifty Creek in Logan Co., beginning at a black oak thense westward as the law directs for compliment." [Logan Co., Ky., Court records, book 2, pg. 213] At this time, ISAAC, JACOB and JOSEPH TURNBOW, all believed to be brothers of Andrew, were granted claims to land in Logan Co.

In 1802, Andrew Turnbow gave, to Isaac Turnbow, power of attorney relative to his land in Logan Co. [Adair Co. Court records, deed book A.] In 1812 the Adair Co. Court records show that Isaac Turnbow

gave power of attorney to Andrew Turnbow [Book A, pg. 454]

Adair Co. Court orders of June 6, 1803, book A, pg. 6 we find; "The persons appointed to view and report the nearest and best way for a road to be opened from Columbia to John Philips near to Warren's Lick, returned a report which is ordered to stand. The said road hereby established and that John Bryant be the surveyor from Columbia to Russell's Creek above OLD MR. TURNBOW'S, and that all the lands in the following bounds, to wit: Beginning at Columbia thense with road that leads to Greasy Creek to the distance that is cut, thense to the mouth of Russell's Creek thense to include JOHN TURNBOW SENR., then to Sulphur fork." Adair Co. Court records, Aug. 1, 1803 Vol. A, pg. 81, "SAMUEL TURNBOW moved the court for a certificate for 150 acres of land on Russell's Creek. Ordered that the granting of same and the investigating to be continued, until next Court."


Adair Co. Court records, Nov. 7, 1803, Vol. A, pg. 86, "The County to the following persons: to JOSEPH TURNBOW, for one wolf scalp, over six months old, \$8.00" Adair Co. records, March 4, 1805. "JOHN TURNBOW relinquished his entry of 200 acres of land granted him by Green (County) Court, Cert. No. 59. Same having made satisfactorily proof a certificate is granted him for 195 acres of land on the waters of Russell's Creek." Adair Co. Court, Feb. 3, 1806, Vol. A. pg. 203. "JAMES TURNBOUGH 195 acres on Russell's Creek, granted a certificate for County grant of land after satisfactory proof."

On the same day as above, "SAMUEL TURNBOUGH, made proof — for 150 acres on waters of Russell's Creek."

Adair Co. Court record, July 7, 1806, Vol. A. pg. 222. "The persons appointed to view and report to the Court the nearest and best way for a road to be opened from TURNBOUGH's to Shelton's Lick returned a report." Adair Co. Court, April 3, 1809, Vol. B. pg. 109. "Ordered that David Bishop be surveyor of the road leading from Columbia to Campbell's Ferry, or so much thereof as lies between Glenn's Fork and GEORGE TURNBOW'S —." Adair Co. Court, Oct. 2, 1809, Vol. B. pg. 153. "Ordered Nathan Robertson, Henry Edwards, Hugh Gilbreath, John Gilbreath, and Meredith Archer — do view a way for a road to be

opened from OLD MR. TURNBOW'S to intersect the Pulaski Road —." Adair Co. Court, July 2, 1810, Vol. B. pg. 192. "Ordered that the following hands and in the bounds therein beginning at Hugh Gilbreath's, James Oram, John Turnbow, Hugh Turnbow, John Folders, Wm. Folders, Wm. McCormack, Benj. Ryan, Joseph Michael, and Solomon Michael do assist James Turnbow in keeping the road open of which he is surveyor." Adair Co. Court, Oct. 2, 1810, Vol. B. pg. 193. "Ordered that the following hands in the boundaries therein to wit: Beginning at the Bubbling spring thense so far as to include Jacob Turnbow's, thense to the mouth of Revnolds creek —."

The "OLD MR. TURNBOW" and the "JOHN TURNBOUGH SENR.", above mentioned, are one and the same person, and the same as the JOHN TURNBOUGH of Greenville Co. South Car. in 1790.

From Adair Co. Deeds, July 4, 1809, Vol. B. pg. 302, we find CEORGE TURNBOUGH sold, for \$500.00, a tract of 59 acres to Aaron Williams — described as "lying and being in Adair Co. on the waters of Reynolds Creek, a branch of Russell's Creek." From Adair Co. deeds, April 1, 1809, Vol. B. pg. 211, we find JOSPEPH TURNBOW bought a tract of 150 acres for the sum of Ninety Pounds, from one Michael Hoofman. The land described as being "on the waters of Cabin Fork of Russell's Creek." The deed records also show JACOB TURNBOW selling 114 acres on Russell's Creek, Dec. 9, 1811. Book C. pg. 110.

The above notes are given merely to show that JOHN TURNBOW, SENIOR, and several of his sons were all living together in Adair Co.,

and all in the vicinity of Russell's Creek.

About the year 1811, our Andrew with his wife and three or four children, went from Adair Co., Ky., to Tenn. and settled, first, in Maury Co., then later moved across the line into Giles Co. At this same time, many other Turnbow and Coffee families moved into Tenn., and settled in the counties of Giles, Maury, Lawrence, Lewis and Wayne, all Counties in the central southern part of the State.

James Turnbow, brother to Andrew (their wives were sisters) also lived in Maury Co. and in 1811, we find James and Andrew signing a petition to the Tenn. General Assembly with regards to land titles.

It is believed the John Turnbow Senior came to Tenn., and that he was the older man in James' household in 1820 census. More on John Senior in a later chapter.

CHESLEY and MARGARET COFFEE, with some of their children, also moved from Adair Co., Ky., to Tenn. at the same time the Turnbows came, and lived in Maury Co. More on them later.

Andrew and Grace Turnbow were parents of a large family. We do not know the names of all their children, and we are uncertain about two who may, or may not, have been their children. Their younger children were all born in Giles Co., Tenn., and all their children grew up there. In the book "Turnbow-Turnbough Family, U. S. A." compiled by Olive Stone, she has the GRACIE TURNBOW who married MARTIN HARRISON JOHNSTON, listed as a daughter of Andrew and Grace. This is an error, as she was the dau. of JAMES TURNBOW, and FELICIA (COFFEE) and was the niece of Andrew and Grace. Following is a list of the known children of Andrew and Grace and the approximate years of birth as we have been able to work out from family data, census records and other bits of information gathered from many and various sources.

I — JAMES TURNBOW, the first child, b. 1803 in Adair Co., Ky. He was living in Lawrence Co., Tenn., in Jan. of 1846 when he gave power of attorney to his brother, CHESLEY TURNBOW, of Pope Co., Ark., regarding the estate of their father, deceased.

We do not know the first wife of James (the early marriage records of Giles Co., Tenn., were all destroyed.) JAMES was md. a second time in Lawrence Co., Tenn., Sept. 23, 1844 to HANNAH FREEMAN. The family was in Lawrence Co. in 1850, with these chil.; all by the first

THOMAS JEFFERSON TURNBOW came, with his family, to Texas and was living in Wise Co. in 1880. When he applied for a Confederate pension in 1899 he stated he had been a resident of Jack Co., Texas, for 22 years, The Confederate pension files, Texas State Archives, show he served in Company H. 9th Tennessee Cavalry for four years and ten days. He died in 1924 and is bur. with his wife at Gibtown in Jack Co. Of the other descendants of JAMES, son of ANDREW, we have no record. James and his family do not appear in the 1860 census of Lawrence Co., and although many other counties were searched, he was not found.

II — CHESLEY TURNBOW, second child of ANDREW AND GRACE, b. Sept. 29, 1805 in Adair Co., Ky., died April 29, 1880 in Erath Co., Tex. Md. Oct. 4, 1827 in Maury Co., Tenn., to SABRA ROSE. Their family record is given in a previous chapter.

III — We believe a son, b. about 1807 fits in here, but we do not have his name.

IV — JOHN BUTLER TURNBOW, b. 1809. His descendants say he was b. in Tenn. I think he was b. in Adair Co., Ky. He died 1886, in Pope Co., Ark., bur. at Rock Springs, Pope Co., with his wife and other members of the family. He was md. about 1832 in Tenn. to KATHRYN KNOWLES, b. 1815 at Columbia, Tenn. JOHN B. TURNBOW was living in Marshall Co., Tenn. in 1846 when he gave power of attorney to his

brother, CHESLEY TURNBOW. He was still there, with his family of 7 children in 1850. Sometime before 1860 the family removed to Pope Co., Ark., and there remained, where they reared large families, and many of their descendants live today. John B. Turnbow and his wife were said to be faithful members of the Presbyterian Church and some of their descendants became Presbyterian ministers. Their chil.:

10 — LAVINA "LOU" TURNBOW, the youngest child of John Butler and Kathryn (Knowles) Turnbow, was b. 1859 in Pope Co., Ark. Md. 10-17-1876 to MARION TATE, a pioneer doctor. Their chil.; all born and reared in Pope Co., Ark. Porter Tate, Scott Tate, Alva Tate, Brooks Tate, Erby Tate, and daus., Winsey and Ruby Tate. One son, Alva Tate and two grandsons, also became physicians.

Some of the data on the above John Butler Turnbow family was sent to me in 1962 by a great grandson, Marvin Hurley, now deceased. He was, at that time, executive vice president of the Houston Chamber of Commerce. Other bits came from Court records of Pope Co., census rcords of Tenn. and Ark. Some birth records came from the files of Laura (Turnbow) Williams of McAlester, Okla. The later descendants would number into the thousands.

V — We think there would be a son of ANDREW and GRACE TURN-BOW, born 1810 or 1811, who would fit in here, but we are not sure of his name, may have been WILLIAM, and we will discuss him later.

VI - A DAUGHTER, BORN ABOUT 1812, who married BENJAMIN B.

ROSE, brother to great grandmother, Sabra Rose. We do not have her given name. She died in Ark., before 1850. A brief history of her family is given in the Chapter on FRANCIS M. ROSE, and ELIZABETH (CUTBIRTH.)

VII - Believe there was a son born about 1814. Do not have his name.

VIII — To the best of our belief, this eighth child would have been LANDON H. TURNBOW, born about 1816 in Giles Co., Tenn. He was md. in Madison Co., Miss., in 1843 to MALINDA CRANE. In 1846 when LANDON H. TURNBOW gave Power of Attorney to his brother, CHESLEY TURNBOW, of Pope Co., Ark., he was living in Claiborne Co., Miss. Family tradition tells that LANDON TURNBOW rode horseback, in the company of a friend, to the gold rush in Calif. We know he went before 1850, for we find his wife, MALINDA TURNBOW. living in the household of Frances Crane, a widow, of Madison Co.. Miss. We think there is no doubt that Frances Crane was her mother. Evidently Landon and Malinda had no children.

The story told by the family continues to say that Landon was returning home by way of a clipper ship, bringing, with him. some gold to be sold at the mint in New Orleans. Some where on the high seas he was murdered, presumably for the gold, and his body thrown overboard. His friend, and partner, lived to get home and tell the story.

Uncle Lewis Turnbow has told me, more than one time, that great grandfather always said his brother, Landon, was the strongest, the most agile, and the best all-around man, physically, he ever knew.

IX — MARGARET TURNBOW, the 9th child of Andrew and Grace, was born 1818, (as per 1850 census). Md. in Tenn. to SAMUEL BATEMAN, b. about 1817, in Tenn. IN 1850 they were living in Chickasaw Co., Miss. At that time they had these chil.: MARY J., age 12. FRANCES, 10. NANCY, 8. SAMUEL, 6. JOSEPH, 4, and ROSANNAH, 2. The place of birth of children show the family left Tenn. about 1841. Samuel Bateman is shown in the census as a well to do farmer. There were prob. other children younger than those shown in 1850. The family was not found in Chickasaw Co. in 1860.

X — FELICIANA TURNBOW, the 10th child of Andrew and Grace, was born 1820 (as per census). Md. in Tenn., to HENRY J. JOHNSON, b. 1816 in Tenn. They were living, in 1850, in Pope Co., Ark., and he was listed as "cabinet maker." At that time they had these chil.: ANDREW C., age 10. JOHN B., 7. DAVID M (?) 5. GRACY J. C., 4, and HENRY CLAY, 2. The birthplace and age of children, show the family came from Tenn., to Ark., at the same time as other Turnbow connections. There were likely more children than those shown in 1850. The family was not found in the 1860 census. HENRY CLAY JOHNSON, the youngest of the children in 1850, md. MARY JANE JOHNSTON, a granddaughter of JAMES and FELICIA (COFFEE) TURNBOW, and was living in Wise Co., Tex., in 1880, with these chil.: JAMES F., age 9. SARAH M., 6.

MARY L., 4. GEORGIA ANN. 2, and twins, ELIZA A., and ALMARINE, 4 months.

XI — NANCY LOUISE TURNBOW, b. Jan. 23, 1822 in Giles Co., Tenn. We are placing her the 11th child of Andrew and Grace, but she may have been the 12th. She was md. Feb. 27, 1844 in Pope Co., Ark., to WILLIAM HENRY GILBREATH, b. Jan. 29, 1823 in Maury Co., Tenn., the son of James Gilbreath and Elizabeth (Baker.) James Gilbreath enlisted in the Army in Columbia, Ky., and served in the War of 1812 [U. S. pension files.] WILLIAM HENRY GILBREATH and wife, NANCY, were a part of Cheslev Turnbow's wagon train when the families came to Texas in 1855. They settled on land about six miles south of the present town of Dublin, and near to the place where Nancy's brother, Chesley, settled with his family. One child, Houston Gilbreath, was born to them after they came to Tex. Seven years after the family settled on Reslev Creek. William Henry Gilbreath died. of typhoid fever. on May 2, 1862. The little son, Houston, died of the fever one week later. Nancy Gilbreath lived until Feb. 13, 1883, and is bur, with her husband and many of their descendants at Barbee Cem. in Erath Co.

The death of her husband left Nancy on the frontier with seven children to support, but she proved equal to the challenge. In future years she managed to add more than 300 acres of land to her property, and reared her children to be responsible, and respected, men and women.

William Henry and Nancy Gilbreath were charter members of "Bosque Church" the first organized church membership in Erath Co. After her husband's death, Nancy became a charter member of Bethany Primitive Baptist Church, organized 1875 in the present Purves community. Their chil., all born in Pope Co., Ark., except the youngest.

James Thomas Gilbreath was sheriff of Comanche Co. for 6 years. Several years ago Adaline (Lowry) Gilbreath wrote something of her childhood recollections of coming to Texas. Quoted here are excerpts, only, from the article.

"I was born July 5, 1873 in Boone Co., Ark. — father moved us to Texas in 1878. There were seven children. We moved in two wagons, and there were several other families, also moving, with all their belongings to Texas. We had five head of horses. The party was two months on the road. At the big rivers they would have to unload the wagons and take them apart to cross on the ferry boats. In Indian Territory, now Okla., the men in the party would have to stay up all night to watch the horses.

"Father stopped a mile south of Meridian (Bosque Co.) and rented land —. Some of the things I remember best include the great herds of Longhorn cattle that passed by our house. We lived on the trail road and when we would hear the cowboys whooping my younger brother and I would go in the house and watch them go by.

"The freighters would camp near our house and father would talk with them. Freighters would go from Dublin to Waco for supplies.

"Father moved 10 miles north of Morgan on Hill Creek. He sold out there in 1889; got \$5.00 a head for the cattle. We moved to Erath Co. the first day of Jan. 1890. I met J. T. Gilbreath soon after we moved, and we were married Aug. 23, 1891." End quote. Children of James Thomas and Mary Adeline Gilbreath.

Turnbow of the County of Maury in the State of Tenn., am his son, and as such entitled to a distributive share of his said estate. Now therefore I do hereby nominate, and appoint my brother. CHESLEY TURNBOW of said Polk (Pope) County in Arkansas, my true and lawful attorney, for me and in my name — to receive and keep in his possession for me all that may be coming to me of my father's estate until I call on him for it, and to use my name in settling up said estate. Hereby ratifying all which my said attorney may lawfully do in and about this business by virture of these presents. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day of July 1846."

"A. H. Turnbow"

We believe ANDREW H. TURNBOW, married twice. Maury Co., Tenn., marriage records show; Andrew H. Turnbow married Feb. 9, 1845 to ELIZABETH TURNBOW. In the Maury Co. marriage records, we find; A. H. TURNBOW married Nov. 20, 1855 to SARAH MCBRIDE. We have not found him in any census record, although many have been searched. Nothing is known of his family, if any.

XIV — There may have been a daughter born to Andrew and Grace Turnbow about 1827, who died young. This is supposition only, but census records indicate there was a girl about this age. Some researchers say Andrew and Grace Turnbow had a son, HICKLAND, but he does not appear in any census, deed, or marriage record I have found. Could it be possible that Hickland was the middle name of Andrew H., Landon H., or Joseph H. Turnbow?

Some sources give WILLIAM as a son of Andrew and Grace, but, to me, it appears doubtful, as he did not sign the deed with the other heirs when Andrew's estate was settled. The William in question was living in Pope Co., Ark., in 1860. He was then a widower, age 50, b. in Ky., with children; Eliza, age 14. George W., 10, and Amos, 4. Living in the same household was George Turnbow, age 45, wife Syrena. Chil.: John, 14.

James W., 10. Nancy A., 9. William, 8. Eliza, 2. Andrew, 1 mo. Grace Rose, 24, b. Tenn., was living with these families.

We believe the above, William, was the William Turnbow, 48, who married in Pope Co., Ark., Nov. 7, 1860, to Mary Arthur, age 30. In 1880 he is living in Lonoke Co., Ark., and is again a widower. Two children by the second marriage, James, 18, and Andrew, 6. A grandson, William Wilson, is living with him.

There was another William Turnbow, I once thought was a son of Andrew. I quote from a letter, concerning that William, written May 20, 1938, by A. J. TURNBOW, of Shreveport, La., and addressed to this writer. Quote. "In answer to your letter of May 14, 1938. I will be glad to give you all the information I have regarding my family. My grandfather, as are my father and mother, are all dead. I have lost track of any record they had, but will tell you all I can from memory - mv grandfather, WILLIAM TURNBOW, was the only one by that name who came on into Louisiana, and settled in Red River Parish, near Coushatta, La. He had five children, four boys and one girl. The boys — JAMES CHESLEY, JOHN JACKSON, WILLIAM and JOSEPH. JOSEPH being my father. All the above are dead. My uncle James had four sons -. B. W. Turnbow of Edinburg, Tex. Daniel J. Turnbow, Kilgore, Tex. William Chesley Turnbow, oil man of Longview, Tex., and R. N. Turnbow, of Shreveport, La. Uncle John has only one living son, William Chesley Turnbow of Shreveport, La. My father, Joseph, has three living sons. Myself, and Clarence E. Turnbow of Quitman, La. C. C. Turnbow of Ionesboro, La.

"My grandfather was in the Civil War, and died during that time. in the year of 1865, at Alexandria, La.

"Any time you are in Shreveport, get in touch with us — I feel sure we are related. Thanks for writing."

The writer of the above letter has been deceased for many years. He mentions in the letter; "An old lady in McShee, Ark., by the name of Turnbow, who remembered all about the family crossing the Mississippi into Ark." End quote. This family is certainly closely connected with our branch, but just what the connection was is not known.

CHESLEY COFFEE, born 1755

and

MARGARET BALDWIN, born _____?

CHESLEY COFFEE was born Nov. 19, 1755 in Virginia, and died Sept. 18, 1818 in Maury Co. Tenn. These dates, taken from the gravestone, are given in "They Passed This Way" Vol. 1, by Lightfoot. The burial site is described as being "on land now owned by Tillman Knox, on Screamer Road, about 1 mile above Ebenezer C P Church." (Maury Co.)

Some researchers have stated that Chesley Coffee was born in Prince Edward Co. Va., we have found no reference to the County. He was married before 1780, place unknown, to MARGARET BALDWIN. Her birthplace and date not known. She was still living in Maury Co. Tenn., in 1820, and is believed buried in an unmarked grave, with Chesley.

Research indicates that CHESLEY COFFEE went with the great exodus of Coffee families from Virginia into North Carolina, particularly Wilkes Co., in the late 1770s. His son. NATHAN, born 1780, gave North Carolina as his birthplace. This is stated in "Biographical Sketches of Ballard Co. Ky." by Battle, et al. Quote. "COL. W. M. COFFEE, was born Aug. 23, 1823 in Maury Co. Tenn; he is the twelfth of fourteen children born to NATHAN and ELIZABETH (GILBREATH) COFFEE. His paternal grandparents were CHESLEY and MARY (BALDWIN) COFFEE; on his mother's side they were HUGH and NANCY (CLEVELAND) GILBREATH. His parents hailed originally from North Carolina; at an early day moved to ADAIR CO. KY., and later to MAURY CO. TENN." end quote. The reader will note the above gives "MARY" as the wife of Chesley Coffee. We know her name was MARGARET, but find in the early records the names Mary and Margaret, were sometimes used inter-changeably.

For further proof that Chesley Coffee was in Wilkes Co. No. Car., he is found there on a tax roll in 1782, and in the same county he signed as witness to a deed.

Some, and perhaps all, of the early Coffee families of Wilkes Co. No. Car., were related to some degree, but we are not able to sort them into the proper relationship. They multiplied prodigiously; with each family naming sons JOHN, JAMES, NATHAN, JOEL and CLEVELAND. This,

coupled with the fact that the early Coffee families of Virginia, were so intermarried with the GRAVES, and CLEVELAND families, renders it virtually impossible to unscramble them.

From the land entry book of Wilkes Co. No. Car., we find; "Jan. 1779, Archelaus Coffee, buys 60 acres on the north side of Kings Creek" (Archelaus Coffee was the son of James Coffee Sr., referred to as "Rev. James"). "Aug. 1779, Joel Coffee line" mentioned in connection with land on "Kings Creek." "Nov. 1779, James Coffee Sr., buys 300 acres — ." "Nov. 1779, James Coffee Jr.," mentioned in connection with land lines. "1779, Thomas Coffee," mentioned with land owned by John Dier. "1780, Joel Coffee, 50 acres on both sides Beaver Creek." "1780, Cleveland Coffee, 50 acres north fork of Kings Creek."

The above notes show these Coffee families were all living in close proximity in Wilkes Co., in 1779 and 1780. By 1800 some of these had moved on to Green Co. Ky. Green was the parent county of Adair, and in 1810, we find in Adair Co., two John Coffees, two Nathan Coffees, two James Coffees, Rich Coffee, Newton Coffee, Osburn (?) Coffee, Sale (Salathiel) Coffee, Eli (Elijah) Coffee, Field (Fielding) Coffee, Joel Coffee, Cleveland Coffee, and Chesley Coffee, all living near "Columbia Town".

We know the younger of the Nathan Coffees there in 1810, was the son of Chesley Coffee, and believe the older Nathan was a brother to Chesley. We also believe the Joel Coffee, was a brother to Chesley. Relationship of others not determined.

From "Lost Links" by Francis and Moore, we find this note on the older Nathan. "NATHAN COFFEE, REV. SOLDIER of VIRGINIA, and wife, had the following children: Joel, Appleton, William, Gracie. Polly, Katherine, married — Baxter. Elizabeth married her cousin. James Coffee." end quote. We know this is the same Nathan, because the marriage of Elizabeth Coffee and James Coffee is recorded in Adair Co. They were md — March 4, 1804.

We also know the "Sail" Coffee and "Field" Coffee above were the sons of Nebuzaraden Coffee. A will found in Madison Co. Ky., Court Records, by Ardery, Vol. 11, pg. 63, reads; "To wife and all children Viz: Joel, Sary, Polly, Fielding, Sail, Nias, Hays, Betsy, and Ruth. Extrs: Joel Coffee, James Coffee and Fielding Coffee. Oct. 1, 1776. Witt: William Allin, Cleveland Coffee, and Marthy Coffee. Probate, March 7, 1797."

We find all the Coffees of Adair Co., buying and selling land, and witnessing deeds for each other. Many of these deeds concern land on "Russell's Creek." The same area where the Turnbow families were living at the time. On Jan. 11, 1806, NATHAN COFFEE sold "to GEORGE TURNBOW, of Adair Co., for 30 pounds, 49 ½ acres on fork of Reynold's Creek, a branch of Russell's Creek." (Deed book A. pg. 344)

Proof that Chesley Coffee also lived in the area of Russell's Creek is found in "The Stray Book of Adair Co. Ky., 1802." It reads; "CHESLEY COFFEE, living near the mouth of Cabin fork of RUSSELL'S CREEK." The "Stray Book" is a collection of old notices that were posted in some public place, giving notice of stray livestock picked up, and being held for

the owner to claim. These notices are of some importance, since they gave the general location of the settlers home.

Chesley Coffee did not leave a will when he died in 1818, but an annual apportionment of provisions had been set up for Margaret, and reads as follows; "Apportionment for Margaret Coffee, widow of Chesley Coffee, deceased. 2 barrels of corn, 1 barrel of wheat, 250 lbs. of Pork, 25 lbs. of salt. 1/2 lb of tea, 6 lbs of coffee, 22 lbs of sugar, 1 gallon of whiskey." (Will book C. pg. 326 Maury Co. Court records)

A copy of the inventory of property of Chesley Coffee is shown in these pages. It is too lengthy to quote here, but some items are extremely interesting; for example:

- "I pare candle moles"
- "I set of tea were"
- "I large loom and weaving instruments"
- "I flax wheel"
- "I cotton wheel" (spinning wheel)
- "4 sitting chairs"
- "5 *bea* stands"

Among many other items listed that would be of interest to the antique collector are:

- "6 large puter plates"
- "6 small puter plates"
- "2 large puter basons"
- "2 small puter basons"

In Nov. of 1818, MARCARET COFFEE, widow, held a sale of Chesley's property. Among those listed as buying at the sale were; James Turnbow, Andrew Turnbow, Jacob Coffee, Joel Coffee, Landon Coffee, and Nathan Coffee. (Maury Co. Wills and Settlements)

We do not know all the children of CHESLEY and MARGARET COFFEE. One researcher states there was a son, JOHN COFFEE, who married SALLY BROWN, and a daughter "POLLY" who married JOHN McCLAIN. Of these two we have found no record, although we do find Chesley Coffee giving power of attorney to John McCLAIN. (Adair Co. Deeds, Book B. pg. 397) This reads, in part; "Sept. 10, 1810, I, Chesley Coffee, of the State of Tenn., for divers and good considerations — do hereby appoint — John McClain of the Co. of Adair and State of Ky., my true and lawful attorney — to convey by deed — unto William Davis of the Co., aforesaid a certain tract of land in said co., 100 acres — being part of the tract whereon I formerly lived — ." This document would lead us to believe that John McClain was, in some way, closely associated with Chesley Coffee, and could well have been a son-in-law.

Of the known children of CHESLEY and MARGARET COFFEE, we do not know the order of their birth, but do know that NATHAN, and GRACE, who married ANDREW TURNBOW, were two of the oldest children. The family of Grace and Andrew Turnbow is given in the preceeding chapter.

Inventory of Chesley Coffee property, Maury Co., Tennessee, 1818.

ELIZABETH GILBREATH, B. 1783, died June 18, 1846. Both bur, at Recess Chapel Cem. in Maury Co. Tenn. Buried with them are three of their children: NANCY, b. 1806, md — GEORGE ALEXANDER, and died in 1827. MARY, b. 1810, died 1826, and JACOB, b. 1817, died 1844.

Other children of Nathan and Elizabeth Coffee, date of birth not known for all.

A — CALVIN COFFEE, b. 1805. A note from "They Passed This Way" Vol. 11, pg. 40, states; "Calvin Coffee died Jan. 22, 1889, age 84, near Campbellsville. Buried yesterday. Died an upright man." He was md — to ELIZABETH FINE (or FIND). In the 1850 census of Maury Co., they had these chil: Isaac H., age 21. William F., 20. Nancy 18. Catherine, 15, Mary, 9. Martha, 7. Sarah E., 5.

The WILLIAM F. of this family md — PRISCILLA HOWARD. A Lieut. in the Confederate Army; he was murdered by renegades during the war. (Confederate Soldiers and Patriots of Maury Co.) By Garrett.

- B ISAAC COFFEE, B. 1807, is said to have married a widow, and had no children.
- C MARCARET COFFEE, b. 1809, Md JOHN DAVIS.
- D HUCH COFFEE, b. 1812, md ELIZABETH _____?
- E LUCINDA COFFEE, b. 1813, md MORGAN ROSS.
- F JANE COFFEE, b. 1815, md HILLMAN WILLIAMS.
- G NATHAN COFFEE JR., b. 1819, said to have died in the Mexican war of 1847.
- H SARAH COFFEE, b. 1820, md FRANKLIN B. HACKNEY.
- I CAROLINE COFFEE, b. ____, md JOHN TODD.
- J WILLIAM M. COFFEE, b. 1823. Md in 1849 to BETTY ANN OAKLEY. Studied law at Jackson College, Columbia, Tenn. Later lived in Ballard Co. Ky., where they reared a big family. He was a member of the Kentucky Legislature. (Biog. Sketches Ballard Co. Ky., by Battle et al) K FRANK COFFEE, b. 182—? md MARIAH GRUNDY.

Some unknown researcher stated that Nathan and Elizabeth Coffee had another dau., AMELIA, who married WILLIAM ALLEN. We found no record of this.

To continue with the children of CHESLEY and MARGARET COFFEE.

- 2 LANDON COFFEE, b. 1794 in Ky., md (1) in Maury Co. Tenn. March 15, 1821 to POLLY TATE. Md (2) May 6, 1848 to Martha Meece (or Neece). In 1850 he was in Giles Co. Tenn., with these children, all of the first marriage. George B. W., age 20. Harrison, 18. Lucinda, 17. Cleveland, 12. Clarinda, 10. Felice (?) male, 8. James K. P., 5. McCord, 3. Marv, 1.
- 3 ISAAC COFFEE, born ______? We know Chesley Coffee had a son, Isaac, who was murdered by robbers near Knoxville, Tenn. in 1799. On April 1, 1799, the Louisville, Georgia Gazette, printed an account of the "finding of the bodies of William Ballard, James Brasel and Isaac Coffee, near Knoxville, Tenn., in Stocktons Valley."

"Evidence indicates the three were killed by the Harp brothers." On Aug. 7, 1799, Louisville papers (Ga.) printed excerpts from the Knoxville papers concerning a reward of \$2000.00 offered "for murderers of Isaac Coffee, son of Chesley Coffee, killed near Knoxville."

4 — JACOB COFFÉE, although we have found no definite proof that Jacob Coffee was a son of Chesley, it is our belief he was. He appears with his family in the 1820 census of Maury Co. One source states he md — ANNIE KELSEY. No other information.

5 — JOEL COFFEE, again no proof that Joel was a son. This note is found in "Genealogy of the Lewis Family in America" by William F. Lewis, quote; "SARAH MACKAY, dau. of William L., b. Rutherford Co., No. Car., married JOEL COFFEE. Had three children: CHESLEY, WILLIAM and DERRINDA. After the death of Mrs. Coffee and the three children, Mr. Coffee moved to Oregon." end quote. To further substantiate our belief that this Joel was the son of Chesley — the Maury Co. marriage records show that JOEL COFFEE married SARAH MACKAY IN MAURY CO. TENN., on March 31, 1818.

6 — FELICIA COFFEE, b. — March 3, 1787, was a child of Chesley and Margaret Coffee, she died May 18, 1865. She was married in Maury Co., Aug. 2, 1811 to JAMES TURNBOW, b. March 22, 1780, in South Carolina, died Aug. 19, 1826 in Maury Co. These dates are from the gravestones, and are given in "Maury Co. Cemeteries" by Lightfoot.

James Turnbow, was a brother to our Andrew Turnbow, although some of his descendants now spell the name without the W.

The known children of FELICIA (COFFEE) and JAMES TURNBOW are as follows. It is interesting to note they named children for both our Andrew and Grace.

A — MARGARET TURNBOW, b — ? Md — Dec. 14, 1840 in Maury Co. to PARIS L. SIMS. It is said they were the parents of six children, one girl and five sons, one of whom was killed at the battle of Chickamauga. B — ANDREW J. TURNBOW, b. 1817 (as per census) Md — April 17, 1848 to SARAH A. SPAIN, b. 1825 in Va. In 1870 they were living in Maury Co. Tenn., and had children: Lucie, 19. Andrew, 16. Nathan, 14. Mary Margaret, 11. Ophylia, 5. It is known there was an older dau. Jane, not shown here, and presumed married before this. In 1880, this family was living in Tarrant Co. Tex., and had these chil. at home. Nathan A., 22. Ohpylia A., 14. Joseph E., and Robert E., twins, age 9 years. In this census, Andrew J. Turnbow, gives the birthplace of his father as SOUTH CAROLINA. Still further evidence that JAMES was the son of JOHN OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

Andrew J. Turnbow, a double cousin to our Chesley Turnbow, is said to have died in Tarrant Co. Tex., in 1887, and bur. at White Chapel Cem. His wife died in Okla. This last from the records of Dorothy (Riddle) Marsh, of Baxter Springs, Kansas, a descendant of James and Felicia Turnbow.

C — ELIZABETH TURNBOW, is said to have md — a MATTHEWS, and had two children. No further record.

D — GRACIE M. TURNBOW, b. 2-15-1819. Md — In Maury Co. 9-14-1842 to MARTIN HARRISON JOHNSTON. Their chil:

D1 - ELIZABETH JOHNSTON, b. 1844.

D2 - JAMES C. JOHNSTON, b. 1845.

D3 - HARVEY M. JOHNSTON, b. 1846.

D4 — MARGARET JOHNSTON, b. 1848.

D5 — MARY JANE JOHNSTON, b. 1850. Md — HENRY CLAY JOHNSON; see this family in the chapter on Andrew Turnbow, under FELICIANA TURNBOW, who md — HENRY J. JOHNSON.

D6 - FERDINAND J. JOHNSTON, b. 1852.

D7 - MARTIN JOHNSTON, b. 1853.

D8 — SARAH ELIZA JOHNSTON, b. 1856.

D9 — SAMUEL GEORGE JOHNSTON, b. 1858.

GRACIE and MARTIN HARRISON JOHNSTON, went from Tenn., to Taney Co. Mo., and from there to Tex. He died while in the Confederate Army, and Gracie later md - David McClain, and died 1890 in Parker Co. Tex. Some of the birthdates of the family come from Louise Parsons, of El Monte, Calif., a great great granddaughter of Gracie and Martin H. Johnston.

E — WILLIAM CLAIBORNE TURNBOW, b — ? Md — in Maury Co., Tenn. 5-1-1851 to SARAH JANE MATTHEWS. Thought to have had 4 children. He died in Ark., his remains later removed to Maury Co., Tenn. F - JAMES COFFEE TURNBOW, b. 1820, died 6-14-1870 in Marion Co., Ark. Bur. at Riddle Cem. Md — 1841 or 1842 in Taney Co., Mo., to ELIZA ONSTOTT, b. 1824 in Ill., the dau, of David Onstott, and Peggy (Smith). Died 1-5-1865. Bur. same as above. Their chil; all born in Taney Co. Mo., or the bordering Marion Co. Ark.

F1 — SILAS CLAIBORNE TURNBOW, b. 5-6-1844, died 1925. Md — MATILDA HOLT.

F2 — JEFFERSON NEWTON TURNBOW, b. 3-26-1847. Died 12-12-1925. Md — (1) HULDA JOHNSON. (2) MAYLE MARTIN.

F3 — LAFAYETTE TURNBOW, b. 1848, died age 20 years.

F4 - MARGARET FELICIA TURNBOW, b. 4-1-1851. Md — in 1869, to RUFUS M. JONES. Lived in Missouri.

F5 - MARY LUCY TURNBOW, b. 1855, died April 1868.

F6 — GRACIE ELMIRA TURNBOW, b. 1-17-1857. Died 1900. Md — 1-21-1875 to ISAAC NAVE.

F7 — JAMES DAVID TURNBOW, b. 2-10-1860. Died 9-23-1900. Md — 1880 to CHENESE MARTIN.

F8 — SARAH ELIZA TURNBOW, birthdate unknown. Md — WILLIAM TREADWAY and lived in Ark. Said to have had a big family.

F9 — ANDREW TURNBOW, b. 10-15-1863. Died 6-12-1946. Md — HATTIE NAVE. (She was prob. a sister to Isaac Nave).

F10 — ELIZABETH TURNBOW, b. 7-1-1866. Died 6-27-1899. Md — HENRY EDWARD UPTON.


Birthdates and marriages of the children of JAMES COFFEE TURNBOW and ELIZA (ONSTOTT) are from the family files of Dorothy

(Riddle) Marsh, of Baxter Springs, Kan. Her branch of the family spells the name "Turnbo".

G — NANCY A. TURNBOW, b. 3-20-1824. Died in Maury Co. Tenn., 1899. Md — 12-3-1846 to JOHN H. BAILEY. (Maury Co. Marriages) One known child was FRANK BAILEY.

H — NATHAN TURNBOW, date of birth not known. The marriage records of Maury Co., Tenn., show a Nathan Turnbow, md — 11-26-1833 to ELIZABETH BUCKNER. If this NATHAN was the Nathan, son of James and Felicia Turnbow, he was very likely their oldest child.

It is said by some descendants there was another daughter of James and Felicia Turnbow. We do not have any record.

There may have been other children of Chesley and Margaret Coffee. The subject of the following sketch was a descendant of Chesley Coffee, however we cannot place him in the proper family. This from "Memoirs of Miss.", Vol. 1, pg. 565, by Goodspeed, Quote, "CHESLEY COFFEE, native of Maury Co. Tenn., went to Miss. at age 15 and became apprentice shoe maker; later was a successful business man and plantation owner. Served as Captain in the Mexican War of 1847, and also in the War of 1861. Md — Miss M. S. Davis in 1849, and died at his home in Fayette, Miss. in 1869. He had son, CHARLES C. COFFEE, who was educated at the University of Miss."

There is some reason to believe Cheslev Coffee had a sister, FANNIE COFFEE, who md - Kenneth McKenzie. It was their grandson, Rev. J. W. P. McKenzie (John Witherspoon Pettigrew McKenzie) b. 1806 in North Car., who came to Tex., early and organized McKenzie College near the town of Clarksville. Established in a log cabin in 1841, McKenzie College was, for a long time, the largest college in Tex.

Many descendants of the Wilkes Co., North Car., and Adair Co., Ky.,

Coffees came to Tex. at an early date.

WILLIAM COFFEE, b. 1797 in Ky., son of the NATHAN COFFEE (whom we believe to be a brother to Chesley) was living in Lavaca Co. Tex., in 1860. Ages of the children show the family was in Tex., as early as 1848. WILLIAM had wife. ELIZABETH, b. 1812 in Ky., and chil: Sarah, Henrietta, John, Milton, Newton, John N., and Jane. We cannot account for the two Johns in the family, one age 13, the other 5 years.

Living next door to WILLIAM COFFEE in Lavaca Co. in 1860, was LOGAN COFFEE, b. 1809 in Ky., with wife, MARY, b. 1814 in Tenn. Chil: Mansel, Fanny, William, Cleveland, Robert, and Thomas. In the household with LOGAN COFFEE was WILLIAM COFFEE and CLEVELAND COFFEE, both b. in Ky., and both age 35.

JOEL COFFEE, b. 1790 in Ky., a brother to the above William of Lavaca Co., was living in Titus Co. Tex., in 1850. A note found on this Joel reads; "JOEL COFFEE and MARY KNOX were md. in Somerset Co. Ky., in 1818. Joel received a land grant in Alabama for service in the war of 1812. He later moved to Tex., and lived near Mt. Pleasant. Parents of Joel were NATHAN COFFEE and MARY (SAUNDERS). They had come to Ky., from Wilkes Co. North Car., just after the American Revolution," end quote. In the 1850 census the wife of Joel is listed as "Alice", b. 1798 in Ky. Children, all born in Ala., were: male, name illegible, but we know he had a son William. Others were: Nathan, John, Sarah, Adison (?) and Mary.

The colorful RICH COFFEE, who came to Texas in 1855, and later established Pickettville, the first settlement in Runnels Co., was a descendant of the Ky., Tenn. Coffees. (See Pioneering in the Concho Country, by Bishop Powell, West. Tex. Historical Year Book, 1974)

HOLLAND COFFEE, grandson of James Coffee Sr., of Wilkes Co. North Car., established a trading post called "COFFEES STATION" on the Texas side of Red River in 1837, in what is now Gravson Co., near a

place called "Preston Bend." He married in Texas to Mrs. Sophia Auginbough, and built the elegant plantation home called "Glen Eden". Here they were known, far and wide, for their hospitality. The site of "Glen Eden" is now covered by the waters of Lake Texoma. Holland Coffee served as a member of the 3rd Congress of the Republic of Tex., and was killed by an Indian at his trading post in 1846. His widow, Sophia, was married twice more and has been called the "Scarlett O'Hara of Texas", and "a woman Paul Revere" because of her activities during the Civil War. (Texas Handbook, Vol. 1, pg. 369-695, and Dallas Morning News, April 11, 1942)

JESSEE COFFEE, b. 1796 in North Car., brother to HOLLAND COFFEE, was living with three of his sons and their families in Red River Co. Tex., in 1860. The sons were: JOHN T. Coffee, and wife.

Martha. Chil: Elizabeth, William, James, and Susan.

ASHBY COFFEE, wife Eliza, with chil: Robinson, America, and Margaret.

JOEL COFFEE, and wife, Polly.

AMERICA COFFEE, B. 1801 in North Car., sister to the above HOLLAND and JESSE COFFEE, md — SAMUEL LUSK, and they were in Tex., as early as 1835. Samuel Lusk was a member of the convention that ratified the annexation of Texas to the United States. The Lusk family lived in Washington Co. Tex. (Austin Colony Pioneers, by Worth Ray) There were other Coffee families in early Texas, but those mentioned were directly connected with the families who migrated from Wilkes Co. North Car., to Adair Co. Ky., and then to Tenn.
