Coffey on account of his activities against the union forces, the activities being those of a scout such as burning bridges and such work in the ream of the enemy lines as would harras them as much as possible. In the fall of 1862, I assumed the James of EMERIK W. Coffey under which name I have lived since that date; that I am the Joseph W. Em Coffey whose record was reported to the Confederate Home.
