



MAP OF SOUTH CAROLINA AND GEORGIA, 1733.<sup>1</sup>




COAST SETTLEMENTS BEFORE 1743.<sup>1</sup>


Here is an extensive Trout and Green River Flank which produces no Timber, and but little Water, much Feeds, and covered with a variety of Grass and Herbage











WHITTES OLD VIRGINIA (HARRIOT).


