A PARTIAL RECORD OF THE COFFEE FAMILY - NOVEMBER 25, 1908

Owing to the limited knowledge of the present generation, in regard to the history of their ancestors we are unable to give a very correct and satisfactory record of the ancestors, for many generations past. But from what information we have been able to obtain the first known ancestor came from Ireland, his wife came from Germany. It is stated he had three sons, William, John and Joseph. It is also stated that Joseph Coffee went and took provisions to the army and was never heard of afterwards. John Coffee married and moved to Belmont County, Ohio, of which we will later write. William Coffee Sr. married and lived in Virginia. He was born June 1, 1763. His first wife, Mary \_\_\_\_\_ was born in 1762. They had four children as follows:

1. Abraham Coffee\* was born in Virginia - December 12, 1797.
2. John Coffee was born August 20, 1799 in Virginia. Not married. Died at his home in Salem, Ohio, March 24, 1866, at 6:45 P.M. from effects of Erysipelas or Blood Poison, caused by having a bad corn on his toe. Had his toe taken off March 15, 1866. His leg amputated on the 16th and died on the 24th as above stated. Blood Poison having followed the taking off of the toe.
3. Sarah Coffee was born September 27, 1800 in Virginia. Married to Peter Gruber, lived in Pennsylvania. Had several children. She died April 24, 1864.
4. Joseph Coffee was born July 18, 1803. Died at the age of 18 months.

Mary \_\_\_\_\_ his 2nd wife was born September \_\_\_\_\_, 1777 and was of English parentage. Two daughters were born to this marriage.

1. Mary W. Coffee was born November 9, 1813. Never married and died at her home in Salem, Ohio, December 30, 1885; of Dropsy at the age of 72 years, 1 month, 21 days.
2. Merab W. Coffee was born June 25, 1819. Not married. She died suddenly of heart trouble and old age at the home for aged women in Salem, Ohio; May 18, 1901, at the age of 81 years, 10 months, 23 days.

Abraham Coffee was born in Virginia, December 12, 1797. Was married there to Eliza Dunn, about the year 1824 or 1825. Eliza Dunn was born in Virginia, April 26, 1803. To them was born three children. Mary Catherine, Sarah Elizabeth, and William. They came from Virginia to Belmont County, Ohio about 1832 where Eliza Dunn died of consumption. Second wife was Hannah Dunn, sister to Eliza, they was married in Belmont County, Ohio and

moved to Logan County about 1835 or 36. To them was born seven children. Isaih, John, Robert, Hannah, Eliza Ann and Charles & Joseph, twins.

1. Mary Catherine Coffee was born in Virginia, November 23, 1826. Was married to Thomas Payten Locke in Logan County, Ohio, January 4, 1886. One child was born to them.
  - (1) Mary Elizabeth Locke, born in Logan County, Ohio, September 18, 1847. Was first married to John Moore in Ottumwa, Iowa. Had several children, all are deceased but two.
    - [1] May Moore was born in Wapello County, Iowa, May 30, 1876.
    - [2] Goldie Moore born in Iowa, September 27, 1886.
  - (2) Mary Catherine Locke died in Logan County, Iowa, November 13, 1847. Age 20 years, 11 months, 21 days.
  - (3) Thomas P. Locke died at his home in Wapello County, Iowa, September 2, 1892.
2. Sarah Elizabeth Coffee born in Virginia May 30th, 1829. Was married in Salem, Ohio to George Boone, November 12, 1854. Three sons was born to them in Salem, Ohio.

  - (2) Twins was born March 23, 1862, one died at birth. Charles C. Boone died May 22, 1862, age 2 months.
3. William Coffee was born in Virginia, October 1, 1831. Grew to manhood in Logan County, Ohio. Came to Rock Island County, Illinois in spring of 1855, where he was married December 30, 1861 to Mary J. Sayre, who was born in Rock Island County, Illinois on April 14, 1842. To them was born three sons.
  - (1) Alonzo Coffee born in Rock Island County, Illinois December 15, 1852. Died December 6, 1863, age nearly one year.
  - (2) James Oliver Coffee born in Rock Island County, Illinois, September 5, 1864. Died at Barnes City, Mahaska County, Iowa on May 24, 1887 of Consumption. Age 22 years, 8 months, 19 days.
  - (3) John Milton Coffee born in Hardin County, Iowa, May 21, 1866 and died in Barnes City, Mahaska County, Iowa, February 15, 1887 of Consumption of bowels. Age 20 years, 8 months, 26 days.

William Coffee, the father died at his home in Mahaska County, Iowa on April 21st, 1884 of Consumption. Age 52 years, 6 months, 20 days.

JOSEPH COFFEE & PATIENCE TATEM

It has been claimed, without proof, that Joseph Coffee, I, was a follower of William Penn, a Quaker who presumably was of Ireland, a descendent of the Scotch Coffees (see later page on this). He, (or his son) Joseph II, was a driver of a supply train for the Army during the Revolution, and some claim he disappeared during one such trip. It is also said that he, or the son, went to Lancaster Co., Pa., with his second wife, after the War. It is this family we have positive records of:

Josph Coffee (Coffey) b. abt. 1746/8 of Burlington, Burl., Died abt. 1804, supposedly in Lancaster Co., Pa. One source said he was the son of Joseph S. Cofey. Md. 20 Jan 1768 (1765) At Burlington, Bur., N.J. PATIENCE TATEM (TATCH-Tatus). Issue: 1. Keziah Coffee, b. 31 Dec. 1769, ditto; died 1 July 1862 in Illinois; she married 24 May 1788, Thomas Logan, at Hagarstown, Washington County, Maryland. 12 Ch.

2. Joseph Coffee, 3rd, b. 15 Nov. 1776. He d. 2 Sept. 1838, Catawba, Oh., he md. at Lancaster, Pa. (?) 1798/9; Jane Tatham McCoy.
3. William Coffee, (?) said to have been an invalid, died at Lancaster, Pa. about 1804.

pp 667 "History of Clark Co., Ohio' has this to say, historically, that is of interest. "The first cabin (built in Catawba, Pleasant Twshp., Clark Co., Oh.) that of Joseph Coffee, and not unlike those of his neighbors, was 16 ft. in length, by 14 ft. wide. It was provided with a huge fireplace, of stone, the chimney of stone and clay.

The rude door turned upon wooden hinges, secured by wooden pins. Tough slabs split from forest trees, served as a floor, and a piece of oiled paper, attached to a light frame in an opening in the wall admitted such light as they had during the daylight. Nails, not then being in use, the clapboards forming the leaky roof were held in place by poles resting on them. The hearthstones of that first cabin may be seen at this time (1881). Two or three Indians and the white settlers assisted him."

George Washington was born July 1837 on his father's farm in Pleasant Twp., Clark Co., Ohio. He became in mature life a farmer and stock raiser.

On reaching manhood, he went west and taught school several terms. He returned home and enlisted in Company D, 3rd Infantry (OVI) and went forth to battle for "This great and glorious UNION". He engaged in a great many hard battles and was imprisoned in Belle Isle Prison a short time when captured.

After his return from service, he settled down and married Miss Margaret A. Furgason, a d/o Joseph and Jane ( ) Furgason of this county, 24 October 1865, they were the parents of three sons, (sic) Bert, Mary and Kemp.

Correction: According to his Civil War records, George W. Coffey enlisted as a private in Company D, 3rd Regiment, Ohio Volunteers, on 13 June 1861, later promoted to Corporal. His physical description tallies with the general description of other Coffey personalities: Dark complected, black hair and eyes, 5' 9".

Additional information gives his wife's middle name as Ann. Their children's births are as follows: Bert, b. July 1871; Mary, b. 3 April 1873; Kemp, b. 2 April 1876.

Thanks for sending me the pedigree-chart for JOSEPH COFFEE, b. ca. 1746, who m. Jan. 20, 1768, Patience Tatum. I first checked my charts, and not finding him listed, checked a card-file that I had but recently started, and found this bit of information, sent by a friend in Ohio.

JOSEPH COFFEY, d. 1804/5. "After the Rev. he went to Lancaster Co., Pa., from N.J., with wife and children. One son, JOE COFFEY, b. Nov. 1776, m. JANE McCOY, daughter of Talona McCoy and wife: (\_\_\_\_\_) - parents of Mrs. Logan."

This was #13224, so was probably taken from the GENEALOGY & HISTORY published quarterly in Washington, D. C.

I understand the GENEALOGY & HISTORY have but recently started an index from the 1st publication. and are issuing the index in each quarterly.

This JOSEPH COFFEY, who d. 1804/5, could well be your JOSEPH COFFEE, b. 1846, since he went from N.J. to Pa.

I checked my copy of Lancaster Co., Pa., tax list for 1758, and find in Leacock Twp., listed: DAVID LOGAN. No other data, and none of the following were listed in the index: Coffee, Tatum, Lord.

There were 7 Coffee-heads of families in Pa., in 1890; I do not have the list. This information was taken from book listing the various ways Coffey-Coffee-Coffe-Coffy-Corfe names were listed in the 1790 census and how many were listed in each state: 1 in Maine; 1 Mass.; 4 in N.Y.; 7 in Pa.; 2 in Md.; 4 in Va.; 21 in N.C. and 4 in S.C. Total number of heads of families-44. Total of all others listed in those 44 families were 200 persons.

Since my line came down from Va., to N.C., to Tenn., to Ky., to Ind., then Mo., where my mother was born in 1875, I am unable to connect my known Coffeys with your Joseph Coffee.

My paternal line: Lott, Mannington, Barber, Hambleton, Ireton, etc., came from N.J., (Burlington and other counties) and from Bucks County, Pa., where my late father: Rev. Harry Pearson Lott, 1872-1950, was born - Hulmeville, Bucks Co., Pa.

Since KEZIAH COFFEE LOGAN, 1769-1862, d. in McConnellsburg, Fulton Co., Pa., have you tried the 1810-1820 Census there for Joseph Coffee, her father? Just wish I could help you. Good luck in your search.

Dear Mrs. Lyman:

Thank you so much for picture of William Coffey and the family sheet about the Curl family. I have had a marvelous month of busyness. Believe I wrote you that I planned to visit with several relatives who have contributed information about the older members of our family. Found a few items of interest, but mostly was able to list the original source of various pieces of information which had been given me. My mother's sister, Alice Winters, has a Coffey Bible; however, it contains only the family of John and Cyrene Coffey, no further back. It contained several loose articles, one being the sheets prepared by Chas Roberts about the history of the Coffey family. Being able to read his letter to my Grandmother Sanborn about these excerpts, I am almost positively sure that he did complete his book. I have been trying to find out if it was published for the family and if there are any copies floating around. So far I have received no response from the letters sent to Coffey addresses in Ohio.

You mentioned you wish you had someone to help you with family searching. Because of our little family, I have no way to get away for trips to the library like you are able to do; but if you would send me the addresses of possible family members, I will be glad to handle some of the correspondence. Then when something comes in of value, I can send that material on to you.

Want to answer the questions you asked in your letter of 8 May. Know if I don't answer them now, may forget. So will just list them as I find them in your letter.

- Q. Have you ever studied their teachings? Would you be interested to learn something about it?
- A. Having always had an open and inquisitive mind about all religions, I have probably studied most every religion known today. The LDS beliefs I studied in the early 1960's because some close friends were Mormons. I had no intention at that time nor do I have today of ever joining the Mormon faith; however, I have had the opportunity to read most of your Book of Mormon and was thoroughly fascinated by a presentation by a law student at a mock trial, his being the side proving the authenticity of the LDS beliefs. I have entered into many interesting discussions and debates about LDS practices; but my only interest is from the stand point of learning more about yet another religious belief.
- Q. George Coffey's middle name--Washington or William?
- A. According to his Civil War records, his middle name is listed as Washington. He enlisted as a private in Co. D, 3rd Regiment, Ohio Volunteers on 13 June 1861 and was later promoted to corporal. His physical discription is what I have heard about the Coffey line: dark complected, black hairx and eyes, 5'9". Mar. Margaret Ann Ferguson 24 October 1865 at Catawba, Ohio. Children: Bert, b. 1 July 1871, Mary, b. 3 April 1873, and Kemp, b. 2 April 1876. No Bruce was listed so am wondering if he might have been a son to Bert. He died 5 January 1928 at Catawba. 60
- Q. Should we search the Philadelphia records?
- A. You are probably more experienced than me in knowing what should be searched, but doubt if it will hurt to look into Philadelphia. The worse that could happen is we would find nothing and, for sure, it wouldn't be the first time we have run into a blind alley and probably not the last either.

- Q. Have you been in touch with others who have Coffee and Coffey names?
- A. Yes, several; however, until I wrote Mrs. George Coffey in New Jersey and she sent me your name, I had encountered no others belonging to our Coffey lines.
- Q. On pedigree forms, some of these names you spelled Sanborn, others Sanborn, must be the latter?
- A. In tracing my maternal line back to 1652 I have encountered several spellings. Today we spell it Sanborn. Before arriving at the present day spelling, this name was spelled Sanborn, Saaborne and Sambourne.
- Q. I find "Bert Coffey, (MD) grandson of an Uncle Joseph Coffee (s/o Joseph and Patience Tatum. He was of Franklin Co. Ind. Sounds mixed up to me!!
- A. May be able to clear this up. George Coffey lists his son Bert as Dr. Bert Coffey on one of his Bureau of Pensions forms signed in 1898. And he may have been the Coffey living at Laurel, Indiana, which is located in Franklin Co. The list of people present at the 1925 Coffey Reunion includes Mrs. Etta M. Coffey-Laurel, Indiana, possibly his wife.
- Q. Reference to pew holders David & John Huston, and the Rankins.
- A. This was hardly a question nor do I have any answer, but want to say this item was of interest to me in that the name Huston was mentioned. One of my dad's sisters married a Huston and it isn't that common a name.
- Q. Is there a connection between Isiah Coffey, s/o Abraham and Hannah Dunn, md. Lucinda Bleakney; parents to Frank Sheridan Coffey and the Joseph who went to Clark Co. Ohio?
- A. Thought I had sent you a list of Joseph and Jane (McCoy) Coffey's children. If not here they are:
1. Tatum b. 15 April 1800; d. 3 October 1845; mar. Rebecca Roberts; ch. Jane, Sarah, Lucinda, Rachel, Isaac, Rebecca, Mary, Martha, and Joseph. Do not know the birth dates of any of the children.
  2. Joseph, b. 1802; d. 1844; mar. Susanna Hunter; ch. Sarah, (unknown), John, Ann, William, Jeremiah, Jane, Catherine.
  3. John, b. 20 June 1805; d. 30 August 1837; mar. Elizabeth Curl; ch. Joseph, Sarah Ann, Cynthia Jane.
  4. Sarah, b. 29 May 1808; d. 16 August 1887; mar. Enos Neer; ch. Joseph, Nathan, Jane, Cyrene, Jonathan, Matilda.
  5. William, b. 11 January 1811; d. 18 December 1893; mar. Nancy Curl; c. John, George, Mary, Jeremiah.
- As you can see no Isiah Coffey nor Abraham Coffey is listed.
- Q. Have you read the History of Clark Co. Ohio?
- A. No. Have searched for a book about Clark Co. but couldn't even find a title of such until you mentioned the above. If you have an opportunity to copy the sections about the Coffeys and Dawsons I would appreciate receiving these sections. If there is a cost involved will gladly reimburse you.
- Q. Do you know why Enos Neer would have been referred to as Mahlon Neer?
- A. No. Have never seen that name before, just Enos.

Q. You listed the following family: John Coffee, age 50 1850 b Iowa  
 Elizabeth " 56  
 In this family was Elisa, William F 12  
 Amelia, and William Magee. George " 11  
 Mary " 9  
 Samuel " 7

A. Was this taken from the 1850 census? I have been trying to get an age perspective for this family. The names listed here, except for Samuel, are all common Coffey names.

Q. Could this be our Joseph Coffey: Joseph Coffee, his wife Eve Shular, d/o John Shular of Newton Two. Sussex Co. N.J....but our Joseph said to have gone to Lancaster Co. Pa soon after close of Rev. War....but the DAR says our Joseph Coffee went to Lancaster with second wife, d. 1804.

A. A good possibility he went to Pa with second wife. Note the first material I sent you, I marked one paragraph which said the following: "Now his mother having died Joseph's father was again married, this time to a widow lady who had three sons. These boys were engaged in some enterprise and they induced the old gentleman to indorce for them. For this he soon came to grief--had a large sum of money to pay for these boys which almost left him bankrupt. Out of a large estate he had only one small piece of property left. (this may have happened in N.J. as not the next paragraph.) Joseph then while yet a boy went to Lancaster Co. Pa where he grew to manhood and married Jane McCoy." As for whether this Eve Shular is the second wife, I cannot say, but the dates do not coincide because Joseph Coffey had died several years before the will of Eve Shular's father was dated.

I doubt if I have been of any help. I often wonder what I have sent you. Thought I had kept a record, but every once in a while you come back with a question about a family that I thought I had included. I know I sent the historical sketch prepared by Chas Roberts, a list of John Coffey's family, and the family of William Coffey. Made an error in listing William Coffey's family. For Jeremiah I said he was killed at Milliken's Bend. He died there 17 March 1863, but the death was due to diptheria, according to the casualty sheet with his war record.

There was a reference in that historical sketch that Joseph Coffey may have been in the War of 1812. If he was he was not listed with the federal troops or at least his name is not on file.

I have another address to write in Springfield, Chio. It was the home of Chas Roberts. He has probably died, but maybe one of his descendants inherited the house. If we could just get a hold of one of those books that Chas Roberts was suppose to have compiled we may find a lot of answers to our many questions. Will let you know if I get any response. Sent one a month ago to another address, but haven't heard anything from there as yet.

Hope this finds you well. Hope to hear from you soon.

Dear Mrs. Lyman:

I'm really behind the eight ball in my correspondence. Our little ones have been ill with one thing or another for the past couple of months-- first the flu and now some "bug" which has caused diarrhea. You asked how old our children are. They are young ones--Taryn, 5; Ross, 4; and the twins, Pamela and Tracy, 2. They keep me plenty busy; though it is usually a fun busyness as we all delight in doing things together. We are all looking forward to warm weather so we can do some more camping. We exposed the twins to camping last summer and they thought that was a great way to live. Taryn and Ross have thought for quite some time that living out in the woods beats this city living.

I'll try to answer some of the questions you asked about the Coffeys:

- 1) Q. 1850 census, Clark Co., Ohio, containing Elizabeth Coffey, 43; John Coffey, 24; Millie Coffey, 21; and C.J. Coffey, 14.

A. Believe this is John Coffey's family. He was a son of Joseph and Jane (McCoy) Coffey, b. 20 June 1805; d. 30 August 1857, aged 52 years; mar. Elizabeth Curl, prob. sister to Nancy--William's wife. The children's names don't all agree with the names I have, but their ages would fit into the probable married years of John. The children's names I have are Joseph, Sarah Ann and Cynthia Jane.

- 2) Q. George William v.s. George Washington Coffey.

A. Washington was given as his middle name in the write-ups I have which were originally composed by members of the Coffey family while George W. Coffey was still living. What death date did you have? He was listed as the guest of honor at the 1925 Coffey Reunion in Ohio. According to these records he died 5 January 1928. He had a son, Kemp, and, possibly, Bruce. At 1925 reunion, Geo. W. is listed with family, Mr. & Mrs. Kemp Coffey and son Joseph, Mr. Bruce Coffey.

- 3) Other Coffee names mentioned as possible members of the family.

-John, b. 1782 Price Edward Co. Va. d. 1856, Ga. - doubt if he is related.

-Mary, d/o William & Nancy Curl Coffee, md. Thomas Roberts - She is a member and I have wondered what the first name of her spouse was. Knew she had married a Roberts. She was b. 8 Feb. 1839; d. 5 April 1920, poss. in Columbus Grove, Ohio--home town listed for her son Charles in 1925.

Don't know when she was married, prob. at Catawba though.

-Jacob, b. 24<sup>th</sup> 1833, Beverly (Bevin) - doubt if they are related; definitely not Wm & Nancy's children. Their records are as follows:

William, b. 11 Jan. 1811, Catawba; d. 13 Dec. 1893, Catawba; mar.

Nancy Curl, d/o Jeremiah and Cynthia Jane Romine Curl, 15 Dec. 1831,

Catawba. Nancy was b. 23 Feb. 1811, Catawba; d. 2 Jan. 1887, Catawba.

Ch.: 1. John, b. 6 Oct. 1832, Catawba; d. 12 March 1905, Marion, Iowa; mar. Cyrene Boyd Dawson, d/o George and Susanna Cheney Dawson, 4 May 1854. Cyrene was b. 4 May 1835; d. 15 Oct. 1900, Marion.

2. George Washington, b. 25 July 1837; d. 5 Jan. 1928.

3. Mary, b. 8 Feb. 1839, Catawba; d. 5 April 1920.

4. Jeremiah, b. 1 Oct. 1840, Catawba; d. 18 March 1863. Killed in Civil War. This was the next name you had on the list.
