WILLIAM<sup>5</sup> COFFEY (*WILLIAM*<sup>4</sup>, *BENJAMIN*<sup>3</sup>, *JOHN*<sup>2</sup>, *EDWARD*<sup>1</sup>) was born 5 May 1812 in "on Yadkin River," near Patterson, Caldwell Co., NC<sup>1</sup>, and died 8 May 1893 in near Patterson, Caldwell Co., NC. He married MARGARET ROBBINS 2 June 1836 in Caldwell County, NC<sup>1</sup>, daughter of THOMAS ROBBINS and MARY MORPHEW.

#### Notes for WILLIAM COFFEY:

1850 US Census lists William Coffey, wife Margaret, and seven children. Also one servant, Mary Hawkins, age 21 and illiterate. William Coffey's occupation is given as farmer, and his real estate valued at \$100.

1860 US Census, Patterson Township, lists William Coffey, wife Margaret, and ten children (infant daughter Sarah having died in 1854). No servants listed. William Coffey's occupation is given as farmer, and his real estate valued at \$410 and personal worth at \$400.

1870 US Census, Buffalo Township, lists William Coffey, his wife Margaret, and six children: Bartlett (age 28," farm laborer"), Elizabeth (24, "at home"), Thomas (20, "farm laborer"), Mary (18, "at home"), William (14, "farm laborer, cannot write"), and Margaret (12, "at home, cannot write"). William Coffey's occupation is given as farmer with property valued at \$600, and personal worth at \$300.

To the Editor of the Lenoir Topic: Died at his home on Buffalo, in Caldwell county, May the 8th, 1893, William Coffey, aged 81 years and 8 days. His wife, Margaret, also departed this life April 26th, 1882, in the 66th year of her age. The Lord blessed them with a family of twelve children of which seven remain to mount their loss. Brother and Sister Coffey joined the Baptist church in 1847; was soon ordained in the office of Deacon and Deaconess, which office they executed well. They both lixed consistent christian lixes. We were present at the funeral of Sister Coffey, and remember hearing Brother Coffey express his desire to be asleep in Jesus with his companion. Since that time his greatest delight has been in the worship and service of the house of the Lord, often expressing a strong desire to be freed from the temptations and perplexities of this , and after an illness of about 6 months he fell asleep in the full triumphs of faith and was gathered to his lowed ones that had gone before. William and Margaret Coffey were charter members of Green Rock Baptist Church, Buffalo Cove Road. The church as constituted March 16, 1889 and for a time met at William's home. [*The Heritage* of Caldwell County, North Carolina, Vol. 1, 1983] Notes for MARGARET ROBBINS:

Family record in a smaller Coffey Family Bible notes that a "Mrs Marget (sic) Coffey was born [blank] died April 24, 1882."

1860 US census notes that the 44 year old Margaret Coffey "cannot read or write."

There is some confusion about Margaret Robbins Coffey's parentage. John O. Hawkins in his unpublished genealogy of the Robbins family, lists Margaret "Peggy" Robbins, born about 1790, Wilkes Co., NC, married 15 August 1829 to William Coffey.... The data are contradicted by the presumably more reliable information in the Coffey Family Bible. Hawkins apparently came to the same conclusion, for in his short article on the Reubin Robbins Family in The Heritage of Caldwell County, North Carolina, Vol. 1, 1983, he lists "Margaret who married William Coffey" among three "Believed to be children of Thomas and Mary [Robbins] but unproven."

Marriage Notes for WILLIAM COFFEY and MARGARET ROBBINS:

Though the Coffey Family Bible notes the date of marriage as 2 June 1836, the Index of Marriage Bonds of North Carolina, 1753-1868, gives the date as 15 August 1829. The bondsman is given as John Robins, and witness as W. Davenport.

Notes for LARKIN COFFEY:

Larkin Coffey enlisted in the Confederate army on March 19, 1862 and was assigned to Company A of the 22nd North Carolina Infantry Regiment, attached to the Army of Northern Virginia. He was wounded and captured, probably at the Second Battle of Manassas. He was exchanged and returned to service. On May 23, 1864 he was again captured and imprisoned at Point Lookout, MD. He died in prison on August 4, 1864. Cause of death unreported.

## Notes for Elbert Coffey:

Elbert Coffey kept a daybook during his service in the Confederate Army. The small leather-bound book, now in the Coffey family archives, mainly notes the movements of his unit. It records that he volunteered for the army on July 5, 1862. There are indications that he served with his brothers Elijah and Bartlett; they are both mentioned in what I interpret as lists of debts.

Elbert Coffey enlisted in the Confederate army. Along with his brothers Elijah [and Bartlett], he was assigned to the 58th North Carolina Regiment, Company E, attached to the Army of the Tennessee. He reportedly died in service and was buried near Big Creek Gap, Tennessee. [Application of Eliza Coffey for a Confederate widow's pension, 1887. North Carolina State Archives]

#### Notes for ELIZA E. POWELL:

As the widow of a Confederate veteran, Eliza E. Powell applied for a widow's pension from the State of North Carolina, July 4, 1887.

## Notes for Elijah Coffey:

1870 US Census lists Elijah, age 31, his wife and two children. His occupation is given as "farmer/millwright" with property valued at \$500. Also, two illiterate white servants: Elizabeth Beach, age 20, "domestic servant"; and Porter Beach, 13, "farm laborer."

1880 US Census, Patterson Township, lists "Elisha Coffey," age 41, wife Maryann, 36, and five children, all but Mary "at school." Elijah's occupation is given as "laborer."

Served as private in Confederate Army, 58th North Carolina Infantry Regiment, Company E, 1862-65. Wounded with loss of finger at Battle of Resaca, GA, 14-15 May 1864. Other battles include Missionary Ridge, Dalton, and Bentonville.

Made Master Mason, December 1866.

Member of Yadkin Grove Advent Christian Church, organized 1878 near Patterson and disbanded before 1927.

At his home in Calduell Co., N.C., Oct. 6, 1891. Bro. Elijah Coffey, aged fifty-three years, one month, and sixteen days.

Bro. Coffey leaves in this sorrowing world a wife, three sons and two daughters, all of whom love the doctrine of the soon coming King and kingdom. The deceased was a deacon in the Advent church at Yadkin Grove since its organization; a zealous worker in the cause, a bright example of meekness, and much loved and respected even by those who refused to assent to the doctrines so dear to him. He will be greathy missed by the church, the Sunday School and society, as well as at home. In his farewell words he said, 'The parting will not be long.' Many attended the funeral. In Memory of Elijah Coffey.

To the Editor of the Lenoir Topic:

Many bearts were made sad by the announcement of the death of Elijah Coffey near Patterson, Caldwell county, N.C., October the 6th 1892 [sic], I have been waiting for some one of his many friends to write a more extensive sketch of his moral and christian life, but perhaps a feeling of incompetency to do justice has deterred them as it has the present writer. I read my church and country papers in which I scarcely ever put my name, but I am unwilling that the friend and brother I loud so much should not have a more extended notice from the press. I lived a near neighbor to him for over fifteen years, was at his home frequently, was intimate with him both in moral and spiritual affairs of life, always finding him manifesting that grand and noble Orristian character which becometh no other than the true follower of the blessed master. He was an attentive bible reader and delighted to converse upon the subject of religion. Many times have I seen and heard him express himself in our class and prayer meetings as being ready for the summons of the master's call, and while we sorrow it is not as those that are without hope, for we are fully persuaded that his gentle spirit was borne by the boly angels to the paradise of God. He professed faith in Christ in early life, the date of which I am not prepared to give, joined the Baptist church, filling the place of deacon for many years with other important trusts of the same. He was loyal to our blessed Lord, living the greater part of his days a devout member of the Christian church. In later years he joined the Adventist church, but this changing relationship of churches did not mar nor lessen his faith in Orrist which he plainly showed to the world. He carried his religion into the minute transactions of life, always leaning upon the strong arm of his God. Gentle and kind in all his dealings with his fellow man honest and upright in all things, letting his light shine out before the world which is the only true testimony of a Orristian life. He erected a family altar in his home (God bless the family altar) around which he brought his wife and children consecrating themselves unto the Lord.

He married the eldest daughter of John and Elizabeth Nelson. The Lord blessed them with five children, three sons and two daughters, all of which survice him. He lived to see them all happily converted connecting themselves with the Church, save one little daughter; may that gentle hand of mercy soon lead her into the fold.

He served as a soldier through the late war, being in a number of engagements, Missionary ridge, Dalton and on down to Resaca, Ga. There on Sunday the 14th day of May, 1864, as many of our Caldwell soldiers will remember, after a long and sharp engagement, we were called to cross the works. He being one of the first to scale them received a serious wound in the right hand, the marks of which he carried to his grave. He was with his regiment to the last, being at Bentonville, last battle of the war.

But alas, I must close. His disease had been preying upon his system for more than two long years, gradually growing worse. At length seeing his dangerous condition, Dr. A. F. Houck, his family physician, was called in, attending on him with all the faithfulness and skill of a most noble and kind bearted doctor. His disease ran on until it was soon seen that his case was abnost a hopeless one. But still be bore it with Christian fortiude abnost without a mumur, till at length being fully apprised of his condition, feeling assured that he must soon go; it being about the hour of 4 a.m., while watching at his backside, he turned his face toward me and said calmhy and coolhy, "Why all this suffering? Why not I go and be at rest?" I talked with him in as conforting words as I knew how. Then a genule smile seemed to steal over his face, "If I fall asleep it will not be long until the master cornes." How appropriate was this to him!

"A sleep in Jesus! blessed sleep, From which none ever wake to weep."

Farewell, brother! How true is the saying of the wise man, "A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches; mark the perfect man and behold the upright, for the end of that man is peace."

## Notes for MARY ANN NELSON: MRS. MARY COFFEY WAS BURIED TODAY

Mrs. Mary Ann Coffey died at her home here Sunday at 12:45 o'clock following an illness of about two weeks. She was first taken sick with "flu" which caused her death. She was in her 86th year. Funeral services were held this afternoon at 2 o'clock from the home on West Boundary St., Rev. S.E. Thurlow and Rev. R.L. Isbell conducting same. Interment was at Harper's Chapel, Patterson, ground in Yadkin Valley. The city schools closed at noon today out of courtesy to Miss Mary Coffey, a valued teacher in them.

The pallbearers were nephews: J.L. Nelson, Jr., A.S. and J.B. Nelson, Tom Moore, Carlisle Sagle and Dudley Nelson.

Mrs. Coffey, before marriage, was Miss Mary Ann Nelson, a daughter of John Nelson and Elizabeth Nelson, and a brother of our toursman, J.L. Nelson. She was born February 23, 1843, at the old Nelson home just above Patterson. In 1867 she was married to Elijah Coffey, and to them fax children were born, all of whom are living. After their marriage they lived for many years in the Valley. On October 6, 1891, Mr. Coffey passed away, and then Mrs. Coffey came to Lenoir and made her home with her daughter, Miss Mary Coffey in 1905. For a number of years Mrs. Coffey has been in poor health, but it was only about two weeks ago that her condition became serious, resulting in death Sunday afternoon.

Early in life Mrs. Coffey joined the Baptist church at Patterson, but later connected herself with the advantist church, of which church she was a member at death. Mrs. Coffey was a woman of christian character, and was held in the highest esteem by her relatives and friends.

Deceased is survived by three sons and two daughters, John Coffey, Raleigh; George Coffey, Worcester, Ohio; Lee Coffey, Minco, Okla.; Mrs. J.A. Stewart, Enid, Okla., and Miss Mary Coffey, Lenoir. Also two sisters, Mrs. J.B. Moore, Elizabethton, Term., Mrs. Jane E. Gragg, Blowing Rock and one brother, J.L. Nelson, Lenoir.

With the exception of Mrs. Stewart, of Enid, Okla., all of the children were present when death came and attended the funeral services.

Upon moving to Lenoir, Mary A. Nelson Coffey joins the North Lenoir Advent Christian Church on N. Main St.

Mary Ann Nelson Coffey's will, dated June 12, 1915, recorded January 8, 1929. Appoints son Lee T. Coffey as executor. Leaves her half of the Lenoir house to daughter Mary E. Coffey. [Caldwell Co. Courthouse, Vol. D 222-223].

As the widow of a Confederate veteran, she applies for a pension from the State of North Carolina, Feb. 2, 1925.. In the application it is stated that Mary Ann Nelson Coffey "is not worth in her own right, or the right of her late husband, property at its assessed value for taxation to the amount of five hundred dollars...."
