Draper (cont.)

Guide to Draper Manuscripts: is not an index to entire collection, but is necessary for an introduction. Read Introduction, explains what book does. (Time period, geographical location, and principal person) Index lists only "significant" persons. If indexed, may also have other mentions of this person elsewhere. There is also an "Additional Index."

Do by geography, dates, persons. Especially generation after Rev. which includes non-indexed names, especially interviews of daughters. Always check indexes for names of daughters.

Watch for patterns ie: groups of people from same area migrating to same place.

Federal:

Sometimes shortly after formation of county,
had only 1 book to record everything.

Not all of the records relating to one
area are found in one place.

Some official records of NW Terr are in
papers of Gov & TERR. SEC, some at OHIO HIST
Soc & some with Mass. Hist. Soc.

Many times when county formed not fully.

1. founding sometimes attached ^{formed} to parent county until suff. pop. to org.
2. Organization

a county purposes

b. Judicial organization.

[there may be several years between each of these. May be attached to one county & then another county before organized.

(Go to Territorial Session Law to find out if attached to another county]

Do not limit to county records, or Terr records or federal records — use all.

Territorial Census at least 2 census for a TERR:
1. just before legis. appears
2. a yr or so prior to statehood.

(these are usually found at state level — sometimes in the county.)

Usually head-of-family only.

N.W.Territory Records (cont.)

Check bibliography as well as index. ~~in~~ in histories.

Univ. Library & State Historical Library & Fed publications.

Library of Cong^{microfilm of} Early State Records.
 (also includes colonial records)
 avail on interlibrary loan.

use at lib: Wm. Sumner Jenkins, compiler of
~~catalogue~~ to Early State Records of Library
 of Congress.

Military Records: as part of settlement record in area, had to remove Indians. The people in the terrs. served in these Indian Wars. ie: Blackhawk War 1832, muster rolls + these people had bounty land rights - had to prove who they were and entitlement.

(Request this info from Nat'l Arch.)

If heirs applied for bounty lands, had to prove who he was and who they were.

N.W. Territory Records (cont.)

Also other land records. If there during territorial time, probably records at Fed. level. If orig got land from Fed did not have to file at county level.

Also Newspapers. Check NSPs in next county which may have covered the county which had no nsp.

Ask State Historical Soc. to see if early nsps have been indexed.

11 Aug 1884

Pre Revolution land granted to Colonies by Crown +
Colonies then sold to Indiv.

Nat'l Arch have mainly 1785.

Prior to Rev. mainly city, county + state have
records.

Land Grant records may be found in country of
origin.

Independent cities sold own land.

Researchers Guide to Am. Genealogy. by. Val Greenwood
has best section on land

1785 Land Ordinance - opening of public lands
military warrants 1st & then lots sold by
public auction.

Steubenville, Ohio, 1st Land Office in U.S.

1/32 Acre. Act Provided for survey of land.

1782 2nd NW Ordinance: provided if died intestate
1/3 to widow & rest divided among children.

Wills had to be filed w/i 1 yr of death.

Made resident + non-resident made subj to
taxation

- 1796 * 2 Acre Section limit
- 1800 Lowered to 320A. limit.
- 1820 " " 80 A "
- 1908 1²⁵ per Acre

Sometimes a man bought land for his children.
Watch where & by whom deed notarized.

1830 Pre-emption Land Act.

Squatter since 1829 could ^{buy} 80A @ 1²⁵ per A.

Military Bounty lands.

160As for Mexican War Veterans.

May also be given a 10A timber grant
not necessarily near 160A.

1850 Ext 1847 ACT to 1862 Veterans (160A)

1852 " " to officers (excluded previously)

This was act made benefits assignable.

Veteran could sell warrant for bounty land.

1856 Act ext to include all Vets & heirs.

1850 Donation Land Act. 160A-Single 3rd marr.

Oregon ^{Donation} Land Claims.

Ore, NM, Fla, & Wash. (See only 1 published -
in KC. Public Lib)

1862 Homestead Act. (Age + citizenship requirement)

5yr. residence. Had to be notice in
paper giving witnesses.

Credit Entry File in Nat'l Archives.

Delaware have to have an atty examine land records.

13 Ohio state kept their own land & records in
states, not Arch. Ky, W. Va, ^{MAINE VT NY TX} also retained own land.

County Court Houses:

Public Land States must have abstracts & this includes each heir. Sometimes file partition suit in Circuit Court to divide land among heirs. Check Circuit Court Index. Check vault if possible to see "packet" In Depto vault box. In suit will give name of every heir, incl those not in county - this may help locate heirs in other locations.

Non Public Land States: County Court House.

(Know Person, location, and time period)
Keep a record of every acre of land owned by ancestor. Suits will tell heirs' names.

Check Assessors or County Collector's Office for tax records. Public Information, Deed will show it land set aside for cemetery.

Land Records of W. Va are microfilmed & are in capitol.

Is there an original Survey map or a book with entries.

A Quiet Title suit will give property owner's Descendants. Sometimes listed under QC

Deeds of Adoption sometimes in (Recorder of Deeds?)

Maryland Indexes changed frequently.

Huntsmen & Abatemen were early recorders of deeds.

Ask about all papers in file when ask for military records.

Va & Pa. (Greene, Wash, ^{Fauquier}, Westmore, Allegheny, Monongahela, Augusta, ^{City})
(fr 1748 to 1785) work both States

Va Ct Records in Pa. Itemized only by surnames
not mentioned in Index.
